


FY 2017 PROGRAM ACCOMPLISHMENTS

SUMMER OUTREACH PROGRAM

The St. George Theatre Summer Outreach Program is an annual program that teaches theatre arts to local youth, ages 9-18, with priority registration given to children from socially and/or economically challenged homes. A total of 80 children attended the program during the summer of 2016. Providing free dance training to underprivileged youth is part of the bedrock of the St. George Theatre's mission. Students gained practical skills, such as stage presence, public speaking and audition preparation. They enjoyed free donated lunch each day, dancewear, dance shoes, costumes, writing supplies and books. Lunches were provided by Karl's Klipper, The Gavel Grill, Pier 76, 120 Bay Café, ShopRite and Met Foods. The program began on July 13th and concluded on July 31st with a student performance and an awards ceremony. Dance scholarships were also awarded, and students were invited back with their family to attend two main-stage performances later in the year. We partnered with Girl Power Inc. and Illuminart.



NIGHT OF THEATRE

SGT's Night of Theatre provided free access to a special night of theatre for members of our community for whom a ticket would be out of reach due to financial challenges. Blocks of tickets were donated to community-based agencies who then selected members they determined would most enjoy and benefit from this unique experience. Attendees ranged from children and teens, seniors and adults with disabilities, foster children to the homeless. SGT partnered with Project Hospitality, Seamen's Society, Eden II, GRACE Foundation, Hungerford School, A Very Special Place, Cerebral Palsy of NY State Eger Harbor House, Independent Living Association, Jewish Board/Family Resource, Markham Gardens, On Your Mark, SI Blind Society, SIDDSO, United Cerebral Palsy, amongst others. We are particularly proud to have welcomed over 900 families of children with autism and special needs to a special performance of our annual Christmas Show.

ARTS IN EDUCATION

The St. George Theatre Arts-in Education program delivered professional and educational live performances for grades Pre-K to High School during the 2016-17 academic year. With an emphasis on providing professional arts and theater experiences, the SGT presented performances by regional, national, and international touring companies that connected arts to classroom curriculum. A collection of thirteen biographies, beloved fairytales and shows that featured cross-curricula connections in STEM disciplines, grammar, history, classic literature, and music and/or reflect culturally enduring themes such as honesty, generosity or doing right by others were presented to over 14,000 students, teachers and parents from 79 unique schools. Complimentary custom planned study guides were made available online for classroom planning and use. Shows included Jackie Robinson, A Charlie Brown Christmas, The Wizard of Oz, The Rainbow Fish, My Heart In A Suitcase, Frog and Toad, Seussical, New Kid, Charlotte's Web, Schoolhouse Rock.


AUDIENCE ANALYSIS

If you stage it...they will come!

The St. George Theatre has tracked ticket sales from 2015-2017 and is happy to report that Staten Islanders from throughout the entire borough are attending events at the historic theatre.

In fact, nearly **40%** of tickets were purchased by residents of the **South Shore**.

- This data refutes the **misconception** that South Shore residents will not travel to the North Shore. Local restaurants report significantly higher patronage on show nights, demonstrating an economic ripple effect.
- St. George Theatre has become an established **regional venue** in the Tri-State Area. Ticket sales have been steadily **increasing** year-by-year including a larger percentage emanating from off-island locations such as Brooklyn, Manhattan, and New Jersey. The data shows that in 2015, Staten Islanders made up nearly 70% of the theatre's total ticket sales; for 2017 upcoming shows, about 60% of future sales come from Staten Island residents, further displaying growth outside of the borough.
